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
Many ways of knowing, being and doing

- Share history of connections—photos, stories and books.
 - Family trees.
 - Artwork.

 - Extended family—these people are significant to a child or young person.
 - Fathers and other men are an important part of children's lives.
- Educators and staff members have families too.
